

#### A MESSAGE FROM YOUR PASTOR

During these 40 days, let me put away all my pride. Let me change my heart and give up all that is not good within me. Let me love God with all that I am and all that I have." -- Genesis Grain

I love this quote. I love this quote because of what the speaker tells us about Lent. Lent is a special time where we become intentional with our spiritual practices and prepare ourselves for Easter. Lent is not something we go around or jump over; Lent is something we all go through together. We go into that wilderness, and we come out transformed. We grow closer to God; in fact, we surrender ourselves to God's love. We cannot fully appreciate what happens on Easter morning without Lent. We sing songs like "Christ the Lord Is Risen Today!" because we have taken the time during Lent to understand what Jesus did for us on that cross.

Lent asks us to slow down, stop, and be selfish with our time. We need Lent to help us hit the reset button and redirect our energies towards our spirits. Developing spiritual practices takes time and effort. Lent is a time to try them all-try prayer, read the Scriptures, meditate, do community service, try everything, and find what you are called to do. Because you are called to Lent, you do not get the option to say, "no, thank you!"

When I was a child, Lent felt like a chore because my mom would insist we give up something. I would give up something like candy or soda, and I would complain the entire time! I did not understand the point, and I would not get it until I was an adult. If we are called to give up something, we do so intending to examine our dependence on that thing, and we replace it with dependence on God. If you are called to give up something like coffee or tea, replace the time you spend brewing a cup and spend that time with God. Lean into your dependence on God and see where that leads you!

Lent is here. Embrace the change. Be transformed.

#### HELLO FROM LISA

Each year around March, I start getting that impatient itch to get my garden going again. The catalogs have been thumbed through, the seeds have been ordered and the sun seems to be warm on the face more and more each day. March is that liminal or "in-between" space, where it is not quite winter anymore, but not yet spring. Gardening to me is a spiritual practice. There is a mystical feeling in getting your hands into the warm soil, the smell of the earth, the sounds of nature around you, the act of fostering and my call to feed families in need. life with God as you nurture the seedlings into plants and on toward harvest.

Last year I decided to try something new which had mixed results. I learned what they call "Winter Gardening". The concept is basically to plant certain types of plants in a sealed container and leave it outside. Nature will create a micro climate within the sealed container and when the seeds are ready they will sprout

and grow, much earlier than otherwise. I planted most of my annual flowers this way. You take a milk jug or other container, cut it 3/4 of the way up. Fill it with wet potting soil. Plant your seeds (not too deep!) then seal it with duct tape. Leave it out in the sunshine. When the seedlings are big enough and the average temps much warmer, transplant them!

As part of my call to food ministry, 2 years ago, I created a project that combines my passion for gardening Each growing season, I give my area garden centers a flyer called "Plant a Row for the Hungry". The idea is to plant extra crops each season so that you will have extra to deliver to the food pantry in your area. This practice of gleaning is found in Leviticus 19:9, 'When you reap the harvest of your land, do not reap to the very edges of your field or gather the gleanings of your harvest." Imagine if we all had a little crop of veggies in our yards to share. Neighbors feeding neighbors. Happy Spring and Happy sowing!


