CHRISTIAN EDUCATION

Hi friends,

We started off the new school year with a fresh coat of paint! Thanks to donations of paint supplies and paint from church members and the donation of time from a friend of mine, we were able to do a low budget make-over with a big impact! It's still a work in progress, but the painting is done. We painted the upstairs hallway wall and an accent wall in the classroom to look like grass and sky. We also repainted the cubbies, the door between the two classrooms and trim white. The wall in the upstairs hallway will eventually have a mural of a giant flower with the names of the Fruits of the Spirit on the petals, as well as clouds and a sun with corresponding bible verses. The accent wall in the classroom has a beautiful butterfly made up of a cross and words (See picture below), and will eventually have a breathing pathway and words saying breathe in mercy...breath out worry.

The adults weren't the only ones who kept busy! The children started our Fall series on being thankful for all that God provides for us. They have gratitude for the beatitudes, and they learned to be thankful for God's promises by watching a movie about Noah's ark and making crafts. We will continue to focus on being thankful until Thanksgiving. In the next coming weeks they will learn that God watches over us and provides for us, if we show kindness, by studying the story of Ruth

and Naomi, and that God is there for us even when we're scared, by learning about Daniel and the lion. We will focus those lessons on being thankful that God is always with us. Then I have a special pumpkin prayer lesson for Halloween. It teaches the children that God picked us and cares for us like we pick pumpkins from a pumpkin patch. I will read the pumpkin prayer to the kids as I demonstrate with a real pumpkin, and they will make Jack-o-lanterns out of paper plates.


